Architect Selection

Now that the BEST project bond has passed, you just have to ask, "What's next?. Well, several things are occurring right now. The district and the state are entering into an agreement that allows the state to sell the bonds needed to fund the building of our new school, the district is finishing up all the necessary surveys to describe the building site, and all the paperwork that details the entire bond process from start to finish is nearly complete. While all that is necessary, it is hardly exciting, so on a more interesting note, the district is also hiring the architecture and engineering firm for the new school.

To begin the hiring process, the District, with the help of the Colorado Department of Education (CDE) publishes a Request for Qualifications (RFQ). This document is posted on the District website, and details the requirements the RJ-3 is looking for in its architect. This was posted on October 20, 2011 on the Idalia website. Based upon this document, sixteen (16) firms indicated an interest in the Idalia school project. By November 10, 2011, any interested firm was required to submit a proposal that detailed their firm's qualifications, strengths, personnel, and previous experience in building a rural school. These proposals ran anywhere from 45 to 140 pages in length. Once the proposals were received on November 17, 2011, they were evaluated by the selection committee based on a worksheet provided by CDE. At that point the scores were tabulated and a discussion was held to narrow the list of 16 down to 3 or 4 firms that will be interviewed on November 29. The firms chosen to be interviewed are Klipp, Larson & Incitti Architects, and Wold Architects and Engineers.

The interviews for the project consist of a presentation by the firm followed by a question and answer session with the committee. Also in attendance, but not participating in the interviews, will be the RJ-3 owners representative Michael Hall, and CDE's representative Jay Hoskinson. Having these people at the interviews gives the committee two very knowledgeable people to answer any questions that may arise. Once the firms are evaluated at the interview, the selection committee will decide on which firm best meets the needs of Idalia School District RJ-3 and the project will be offered to that firm. If for some reason a contractual agreement cannot be reached with the top firm selected, the second place firm will be offered the job. *Submitted by Tim Krause*

FFA Chapter Speaking

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On Thursday, November 17, the Idalia FFA chapter held its annual chapter public speaking. The categories were Creed Speaking, Prepared Public Speaking, and Extemporaneous Public Speaking.

Creed Speaking is an event for Freshman Ag students. As a requirement to earn their Greenhand Degree, all fresh-

men must memorize and recite the FFA creed. All three of this year's freshmen competed at the chapter competition

and the top two will be going to districts. Caleb Condrey placed first earning a gold. Placing second was Tennison

Hoyda earning a Silver, and 3rd was Chantz Smith also earning a silver.

The next event was Extemporaneous Public Speaking. This is an event for 10th, 11th, and 12th grade Ag students. In this event, the students draw for a topic which they have no prior knowledge of. The topic is a question involving an issue in agriculture. The students then have 30 minutes to research and write and outline for their speech. The speech must be between four and six minutes with a possibility of 5 minutes of questions. Senior Dustyn Mergelman and Junior Chelsee Carpenter were the two members who competed. Both earned a gold, with Chelsee placing first and Dustyn second. They will both be representing the Idalia Chapter at districts.

The final event was Prepared Public Speaking. This is also an event for 10th, 11th, and 12th grade Ag students. The students pick their own topic, usually and Ag issue that is important to them, and write a speech about it. The students must cite at least three sources in their written speech, or manuscript. That manuscript must be turned in before the contest. The member generally uses note cards to paste their speech on to use during their actual speech. The speech must be between six and eight minutes, with a possible 5 minutes for questions. The member is judged on many different things, ranging from content of the speech, to eye contact, to the volume level, and effective pauses. There were five members that competed at this year's chapter contest. Receiving a gold and placing first was senior Kortnee Spelts. Receiving a silver and placing second was sophomore Makayla Shafer. These two girls will also be traveling to districts to represent the Idalia FFA Chapter. Receiving bronze were the other three participants, Juniors Chelsee Carpenter, Riley Shaffer, and Taylor Merritt.

Judges for the events were the Advisor Mrs. Jill Whomble, Mrs. Kristy Minor, Mrs. Kelli Kite and Mrs. Linda Sackett.
