MOCK CRASH

On Monday, February 26, the Idalia High School participated in a mock crash. The mock crash was part of the FBLA Chapter's Project Arrive Alive. Fifty four high school students and four advisers watched as the Emergency Services teams from Idalia--fire and ambulance, Kirk Ambulance--along with the Yuma County Sheriff's Office, Colorado State Patrol, Med Evac of Northeastern Colorado, and the Yuma County Coroner's office worked the accident scene.

Six FBLA members (Rex Fell, Talon Glanz, Garrett Hurlburt, Madison Wells, Maddisen Hoyda, and Aubrey Richards) participated as victims in this t-bone accident--two walking wounded, two in critical condition, one texting and driving, and one deceased. This mock crash made students more conscious of the fact that driving distracted can affect not only you, but your peers also. After all victims were airlifted, ambulanced or taken into custody, there was a mock trial at the Yuma County Court House in Wray. The texting and driving case was held with the students participating on the jury. Overall, this activity made the students more aware of how their actions can have consequences.

A special thanks to all who helped make this project happen. Lots of hours of meetings and planning went into this project. Without every-

one's cooperation, this would not have been able to happen.




Tosha Wise


