October Board Meeting Minutes

On October 19, the Board meeting was called to order at 6:00 p.m. Those in attendance included Board members Ken Brenner, Amber Hardwick, Kyle Kite, Jessica Towns, Larry Weyerman, Superintendent Myles Johnson, Business Manager Autumn Helling, Assistant Principal Kristi Minor, and audience members Brandi Jones, Scott Szabo, and Chuck Wright. Following the Pledge of Allegiance, the agenda was approved. Next, the September 19, 2018, minutes were approved. During the Comments from the Audience portion of the meeting, Scott Szabo of Lauer, Szabo & Associates presented the 2017-2018 Financial Audit. The Business Service Reports were then discussed and approved. Committee Reports were then presented. Brandi Jones and Ken Brenner discussed the idea of possibly purchasing a food trailer to serve future concessions. Mrs. Minor then gave her Principal's Report, where she updated the Board on highlights of a recent conference she attended along with providing an overview of student discipline to date. Mr. Johnson then gave his Superintendent's Report, in which a legislative update was provided followed by a presentation of this year's Senior trip itinerary. Also included in the Superintendent's Report was a discussion on staff professional development and future senior trips. During the Discussion/Action Items portion of the meeting, the 2017-2018 Financial Audit was approved. Under the Personnel Services portion of the agenda, the winter coaching assignments were approved. During the Policy portion of the agenda, 2nd Reading of KDBA and KDBA-E, dealing with mandatory parent notification of certain employee criminal charges were approved. 2018 Eligibility Requirements

1. Must be a U.S. Citizen.
2. Must attend an Eligible Public High School.
3. Must be a student in the 2019 high school graduating class.
4. Must have achieved a high school CGPA of 3.50 or higher.
5. Must have scored 23 or higher on the ACT (Composite Score) or 1,200 on the SAT.
6. Must enroll at an eligible four-year college the first semester following high school graduation.
7. Must work 240 hours in the twelve months prior to the start of college; from August 2018 to August 2019.
8. Must complete the FAFSA in 2018 using 2017 tax return information; the EFC must not exceed \$6,500.
9. Must apply for eligible Federal and State grants.
10. Must not have been convicted of a felony.

Centennial Mental Health Scholarship

In an effort to raise awareness of career opportunities in the mental health field to members of our communities, Centennial Mental Health Center is pleased to offer its 10th annual Future Mental Health Professional Scholarship Program. The program consists of \$500 - \$2,000 per year awards. The successful applicants will be selected based on the following criteria:

- Graduate from High School or GED program **any time** before but by Summer 2019 (Non-traditional students encouraged to apply)
- United States citizen or legal immigrant
 - Permanent address must reside in Centennial's ten-county catchment area (Phillips, Sedgwick, Logan, Morgan, Washington, Yuma, Elbert, Lincoln, Cheyenne Wells, Kit Carson)
 - Intent to complete a minimum of a bachelor degree in a behavioral health related field (psychology, sociology, counseling, etc.)
 - Submittal of an application, transcript(s), two letters of recommendation, and a 500-750 word essay

 - Amounts coordinate with full-time enrollment (12+ credit hours per semester). Awards will be prorated based on student's actual enrollment.

Applications should be postmarked no later than **March 15, 2019.**

Anna C. Petteys Scholarship March 15, 2019 deadline

This scholarship is awarded annually to three outstanding senior girls from public high schools located in any of the following counties: Logan, Morgan, Phillips, Sedgwick, Washington, and Yuma. The scholarships may be used at two- and four-year accredited colleges or universities in the United States. The amount of the scholarship is \$4000 per year, renewable, for a total of \$8,000 at a two-year school, or \$16,000 at a four-year school. Pick up an application in the counselor's office.

- SAT score of 1200 is necessary to apply
- A personal letter outlining goals and objectives for the future, and giving an explanation as to her financial circumstances as they relate to attending the institution of her choice.
- Two completed personal reference forms—one from school faculty, one from other than school personnel – e.g. doctor, minister, neighbor, employer.

Turn Your Efforts into Scholarships Beginning with the Class of 2020

The College Board is investing \$25 million in a new scholarship program, with students earning \$5 million in scholarships each year, beginning with the class of 2020. Be the first to know when it launches later this year.

The College Board Opportunity Scholarships program is open to Class of 2020 high school students in the United States, Puerto Rico, and other U.S. territories. There's no citizenship requirement. Class of 2021 students are eligible next year. Note: Students who attend Department of Defense Education Activity (DoDEA) schools outside of the U.S. are unable to participate at this time.

We are happy to announce that Carpenter's Mini Mall is donating \$100 a month to our scholarship fund. Supporting our local grocery store will also benefit students who apply for scholarships.

All profits from the drink and snack machines and the use of Safeway and King Soopers gift cards are used to fund scholarships for students who apply for them.

Purchasing and using Safeway and King Soopers reloadable gift cards is very easy. Individuals buying these cards need to reload them at the register for whatever amount they choose. Loading this card can be done by using your credit card, check, cash or debit card. The card is swiped just like a credit or debit card. These cards can be used to purchase fuel at Safeway or King Soopers as well as merchandise. You can still use your store card to get store discounts. 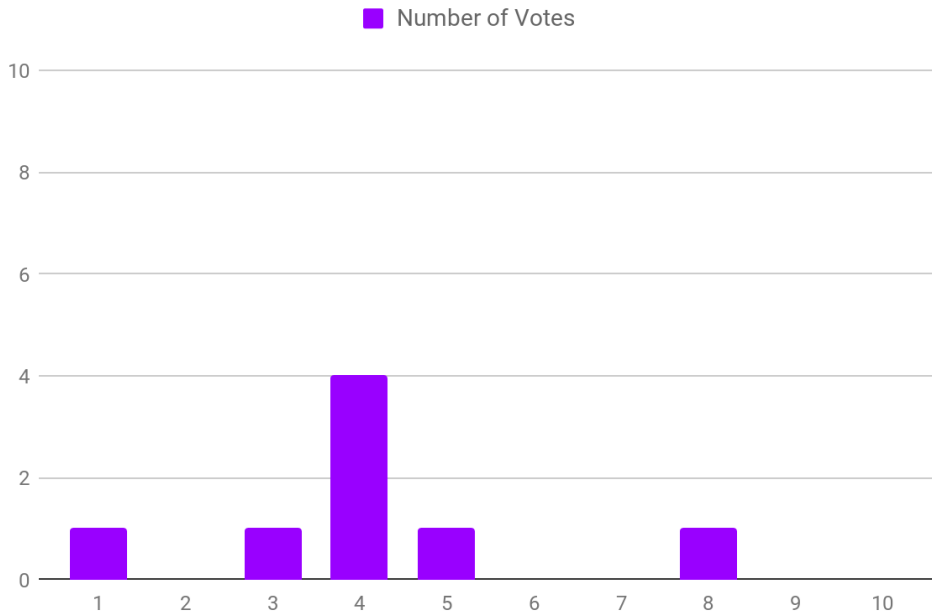

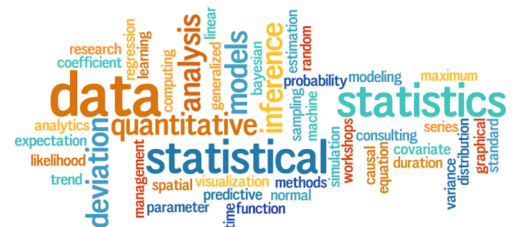
Statistics Class Survey

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YOUTH LEADERSHIP CAMP

JULY 13-18, 2019.

Students, ambassadors, and camp counselors (150 strong) meet in Steamboat Springs for a fun-filled week learning about electric cooperatives. Students stay at the Glen Eden Resort located in Clark, Colorado which is 24 miles north of Steamboat Springs near Steamboat Lake.

Students are chosen and sponsored by rural electric cooperatives from all over Colorado, Kansas, Wyoming, and Oklahoma. The camp is designed to provide a better understanding of cooperatives, legislative processes, energy prices, power generation, and the rural electric cooperative program. The camp also concentrates on developing leadership skills to handle the challenges of the future.

Attendees form a cooperative and elect a board of directors. They are involved in co-op activities, serving on one of the camp activity committees. This provides an excellent learning experience. Field trips include a tour of the Trapper Coal Mine, the Craig Station Power Plant, the top of Mt. Warner, Steamboat Springs, and a raft trip on the Colorado River. Various committees are responsible for planning a hot springs swimming party, a dance, a banquet, and other evening entertainment.

Although much of camp is dedicated to learning, fun is also on the agenda. Participants have the opportunity to participate in activities like beach volleyball, swimming, tennis and dancing.

K.C. Electric will select two winners. Students will be asked to write an essay and it will be judged by a panel of experts. One essay and one application will be sufficient for both the Washington, D.C. trip and the Glen

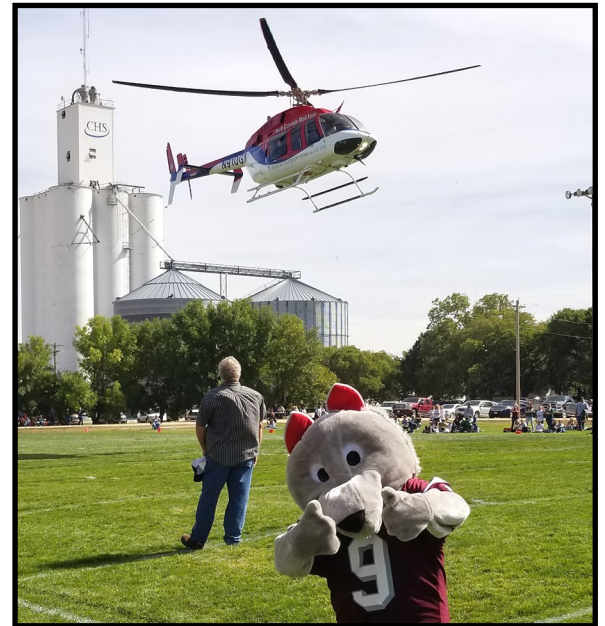
