

# WOLFVIEW



Idalia Families:

The Preliminary Scholastic Aptitude Test (PSAT) and the Scholastic Aptitude Test (SAT) will be administered in April for 9th, 10th, and 11th grade students. The 9th grade will participate in the PSAT 8/9 on April 15th, 2024. The 10th grade will participate in the PSAT 10 on April 17th, 2024. The 11th grade will participate in the SAT on April 16th, 2024.

Tests will be administered at the homestead beginning at approximately 8:30 AM and last until approximately 12:00 PM testing students on reading, writing and language, and math. Students will report to the homestead after eating breakfast at the school at 8 AM. After testing has been completed, students will continue their regular academic schedule. Make up testing for students who are unable to test on the primary testing day will be April 18th, 2024.

The Colorado Measures of Academic Success (CMAS) assessment will be administered this Spring beginning April 8th, 2023, and ending April 11th. Grades 3rd, 4th, 6th, and 7th will take three units of math and three units of language arts. Grades 5th and 8th will take three units of math, three units of language arts, and three units of science. The 11th grade will take two units of science.

The majority of CMAS testing will occur over the duration of five days (4/8 - 4/11). The week of 4/22 - 4/25 will be allotted for make-up testing.

# KEEP EVERYONE HEALTHY BY WASHING YOUR HANDS



When one considers how to stay healthy, the simple truth is that it starts and ends with our hands. Since we explore many places with our hands (the average adult touches over 140 objects each day), it's easy to see why unwashed hands are one of the quickest ways to spread germs and infections. Germs are everywhere, in our gut, on our skin and on every surface we touch. And although many germs are not all bad, helping to improve digestion and keep our immune systems strong, most infections are spread through hand contact.

Proper handwashing with soap and water is one of the simplest—yet effective—methods to prevent infection, protecting you and everyone around you. According to the [Centers for Disease Control and Prevention](#) (CDC), proper handwashing reduces cases of diarrhea by 30% and reduces respiratory illnesses, like colds, the flu and COVID-19, by 20%. In addition, research shows it also helps prevent antibiotic resistance.

## **When to Wash Your Hands**

Although it is ALWAYS a good idea to wash your hands, here are a few crucial times when clean hands make a huge difference:

### BEFORE

- making food
- eating
- touching your face, eyes, or mouth
- touching a sick person
- touching a cut, sore, or wound

### AFTER

- using the bathroom
- blowing your nose, coughing, or sneezing
- touching things that may carry germs, like:
  - diapers or a child who has used the toilet
  - food that is not cooked (raw meat, fish, etc.)
  - a sick person
  - cuts, sores, and wounds
  - animals or animal waste
  - trash



## **How to Wash Your Hands**

Here are the 5 steps to proper hand washing:

1. Wet your hands with clean, running water, then turn the tap off.
2. Apply soap and lather the soap. Rub hands palm to palm, the back of your hands, in between your fingers and underneath your fingernails.
3. Rub them vigorously, using friction, for a minimum of 20 seconds. Hum the “Happy Birthday” twice.

4. Apply soap and lather the soap. Rub hands palm to palm, the back of your hands, and in between. Rinse your hands well under clean, running water.
5. Dry your hands with a clean towel, paper towel, or air dry them.

### **In a Pinch—Use Hand Sanitizer!**

Alcohol-based sanitizers are a convenient option. When your hands aren't visibly dirty, alcohol-based hand sanitizers are more effective at killing potentially deadly germs on hands than soap and are gentler on the skin as they cause less irritation and dryness. Remember that sanitizers kill both good and bad germs, so try to use them when soap and water are not available. And sanitizers do not get rid of all types of germs, like clostridium difficile, which is easily spread and causes GI upset.

There is a correct way to use hand sanitizer as well.

1. Apply a palmful of sanitizer in a cupped hand, covering all surfaces.
2. Rub hands together to move the product over all surfaces of hands, fingers, between the fingers, fingertips, and over the back of the hands.
3. Rub your hands together until dry.
4. Keep in mind water should not be used, and paper towels are not needed.

These simple steps go a long way to keeping you—and our entire community—healthy by reducing the spread of germs!



# Physics


