JANUARY BOARD MEETING MINUTES

On January 16, the Board meeting was called to order at 7:05 p.m. Those in attendance included Board Members Ken Brenner, Amber Hardwick, Kyle Kite, Jessica Towns, Larry Weyerman, Superintendent Myles Johnson, Business Manager Autumn Helling, Assistant Principal Kristi Minor, and audience member Chuck Wright. Following the Pledge of Allegiance, the Agenda was approved.

Next the December 12, 2018, minutes were approved. The Business Service Reports were then presented and approved. During Committee Reports, Jessica Towns briefed the Board on upcoming Health and Wellness events. During her Principal's Report, Mrs. Minor updated the Board on student behavior and attendance records, along with providing an update from the December 17, 2018 Accountability Committee meeting. Mrs. Minor also informed the Board that the school's Christmas music program went over very well.

Next Mr. Johnson gave his Superintendent's Report, where an updated student count (205) was shared along with a legislative update. Mr. Johnson then informed the Board that Maddison Fenner resigned her para-professional position on January 15, 2019. Mr. Johnson concluded his report by discussing mid-year NWEA assessment data with the Board.

Next under Discussion/Action Items, the Board approved the 2019-2020 school calendar and salary schedule. The meeting was adjourned at 9:00 p.m. and next meeting is set for February 27, 2019, at 7 p.m. *Submitted by Myles Johnson, Superintendent*

MORE BENEFITS FOR STUDENT SCHOLARSHIPS

We are happy to announce that Carpenter's Mini Mall is donating \$100 a month to our scholarship fund. Supporting our local grocery store will also benefit students who apply for scholarships.

All profits from the drink and snack machines and the use of Safeway and King Soopers gift cards are used to fund scholarships for students who apply for them.

Purchasing and using Safeway and King Soopers reloadable gift cards is very easy. Individuals buying these cards need to reload them at the register for whatever amount they choose. Loading this card can be done by using your credit card, check, cash or debit card. The card is swiped just like a credit or debit card. These cards can be used to purchase fuel at Safeway or King Soopers as well as merchandise. You can still use your store card to get store discounts. Safeway and King Soopers donate 5% of all money that is used to load these gift cards to the Continuing Education program.



It is easy to purchase a reloadable gift card and use it at either of the two participating stores. Initial cost of each card is \$10 which is already added to the card for you to use. Checks need to be written to Idalia Vision Continuing Ed and can be purchased at the school office.

Overall this is a really wonderful story. You should read this and go on the adventure with Indiana. It is a great story that you should read! *Submitted by Trent Hall*


Amulet Book Review


