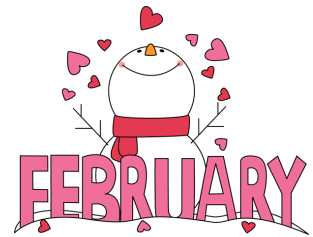

JANUARY BOARD MEETING MINUTES

On January 22, the Board meeting was called to order at 7:10 p.m. Those in attendance included Board Members Ken Brenner, Amber Hardwick, Kyle Kite, Jessica Towns, Dustin Weyerman, Superintendent Myles Johnson, Business Manager Autumn Helling, Assistant Principal Kristi Minor, and audience member Chuck Wright. Following the Pledge of Allegiance, the agenda was approved. The December 18 Minutes were approved.

The Business Service Reports were then presented and approved. Mrs. Minor gave her Principal's Report, in which she briefed the Board on discipline and attendance records to date. Next Mr. Johnson gave his Superintendent's Report, which included discussion on District technology, the anticipated posting of open positions this spring, followed by a discussion over junior high athletics.

During the "Discussion/Action Items" portion of the agenda, the Board approved a payment to the class of 2021 for a fall 2019 concessions adjustment. The Board then approved funding and implementing the "Positive Coaches Alliance" Program. Next the Board approved a 36-month lease on a copier and the senior trip itinerary to San Antonio. The 2020-21 school calendar was also approved as presented.

During "Personnel Services", the Board approved a volunteer contract for Lacey Forostoski to assist with the junior high girls' basketball team. The Board then approved spring coaching assignments as recommended.

During "Policy", the Board approved the first reading of policies ADF and EFEA. The meeting was adjourned at 8:45 p.m. with next meeting scheduled for February 19, 2020 @ 7 p.m. *Submitted by Myles Johnson, Superintendent*

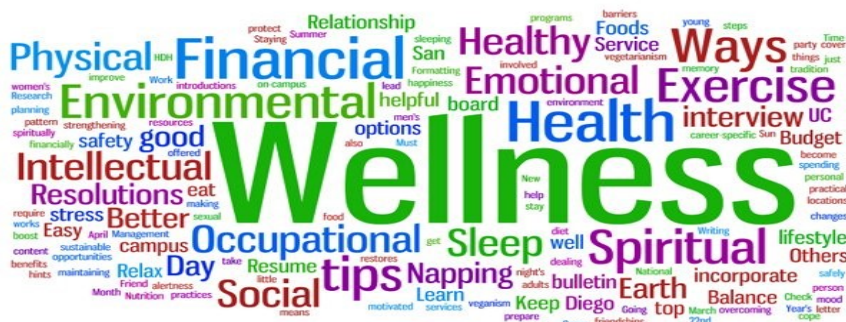

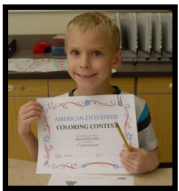


FBLA AMERICAN ENTERPRISE PROJECT

PHYSICS TIMER PROJECT

For the physics timer project, the students were tasked with creating a device that measured time within a 30-second interval. The winners in were; Cloey Jones in 1st place, Macy Richards in 2nd place, and Brandy Henrikson in 3rd place.



Cloey's projects used a plastic water bottle with a flip top that could open and close. She filled the bottle full of liquid and put two drops of red food coloring into the water. In the beaker that was catching all the water, she added two drops of blue food coloring, so when the colors mixed, it would create a purple looking effect. For her to get the water to flow out in 30 seconds she made three small knife holes in the bottom of the bottle. Her final time was 30.04 seconds.

Macy's project was a marble track made of plastic. Her time was a little over 30 seconds.

Brandy's project involved marbles, PVC pipe, and a pegboard. She had about seven layers held up by hooks and tape. Her time was a little under 30 seconds. Nice work ladies!
