


Her future plans are to attend Colby Community College, in Colby, Kansas, and major in Applied Science and then apply for the Dental Hygiene Program.



#### TEACHING KINDNESS

The desire to help and care for others is natural in humans but must be nurtured to reach its full potential. The best way for parents and other adults to promote kindness—and empathy—in kids is through practice. And although the idea of "teaching kindness" may seem abstract, it is simply a collection of small things which can add up to developing this trait in your child—and improve it in yourself.

#### Strategies for Encouraging Kindness

- 1. Model kind behavior. Children mimic the behavior of their parents and other influential adults around them. What you say and do is critical, and role-modeling is the first step in developing this attitude in kids—not to mention, you will increase your own kind thoughts!
- 2. Treat your child with respect. This is one of the hardest things for parents to do--respecting your child through your actions (and reactions). Small changes like NOT overwhelming them with questions which sound like you don't trust their judgment and wait for them to give responses. Give your child control over his or her

own body when they are young, like brushing their own hair, wiping their nose, and adjusting their clothing. Finally, don't answer for your child when questioned by others; by answering for them, you make their opinion less valuable and inhibit shy children from uncomfortable situations.

**3.** Teach your children to pay attention to facial expressions. This is the first step to learning how to understand others' feelings. This is so crucial today, when we spend countless hours communicating virtually through texting and online messaging. Recognizing universal human emotions is key to becoming an empathetic person.



- **4. Don't ignore rudeness.** When you see people treating others harshly, point it out to your children (out of sight/earshot of the incident) and ask them how the situation could have been handled better. This teaches your child that when someone isn't nice to you, you don't have to respond the same way.
- **5.** Recognize messages that your child picks up from the media. Children imitate actions they see everywhere...parents, grandparents, older siblings, tv, movies, you name it. Be mindful of what your kids are watching and when you see unkind/bullying behavior, take the opportunity to talk about what could be done differently. If you see positive (kind) actions, be sure to point those out too!
- **6.** Nip name-calling in the bud, even under the guise of "just kidding." Interfere in situations, even among siblings, where you can point out how one person reacts to the behavior of the name-caller. Name calling can hurt as much as physical pain. Encourage apologies!
- 7. Limit setting up competitions within your family. Even encouraging kids to compete against each other for speed/achievement in household chores can teach your kids that others are potential obstacles to their success. Instead, find opportunities to encourage them to work together and praise them for their group effort.
- **8. Show patience.** Kindness and compassion are learned, and over time many challenging situations will arise which strain the limits of kindness, even for adults. Being a loving parent and great role model goes a long way toward raising an empathetic, tolerant human being.
