Senior Katie McGinnis was introduced to this icy sport in the 5<sup>th</sup> grade when she participated in a Denver wheelchair camp, where she immediately fell in love. Due to the rigorous weekly practice schedule and the travel time, she was unable to join the Colorado Avalanche Youth Sled Hockey team at the time.

After several attempts at school sports in the 6<sup>th</sup> grade, she was given another opportunity to play sled hockey when the team moved practices to Saturday. Thus began her commitment and love for sled hockey. From September to May, Katie and her family leave their Yuma County home every Saturday at 2:50 a.m. to make the journey to practice in Denver. She is on the rink by 6:30 a.m., practicing with the youth team. However, because she is skilled enough to join the adult team, she also gets to practice with them. Katie plays both left and right defense, and has played in tournaments around the country, including Florida, Chicago, California, New Mexico and Pittsburgh, and this year hopes to play in Minnesota and California as well.

Outside of sled hockey, Katie loves spending time with her miniature donkeys, taking them to parades, and driving them around the countryside. Her future goals include trying out for the National Women's Sled Hockey team and



hopes that there will soon be a women's sled hockey team in the Olympics.

Her long-term goals are to begin taking classes at Morgan Community College so she can continue to play sled hockey in Denver, and ultimately to get a degree in Poultry Management. Katie says:" Playing hockey makes me feel accepted and like I'm part of a team. I have supportive friends and teammates, I'm a good team member, and have been

On September 15, the Board meeting was called to order at 6:30 p.m. Those in attendance included Board Members Ken Brenner, Amber Hardwick, Kyle Kite, Jessica Towns, Dustin Weyerman, Superintendent Myles Johnson, Business Manager Autumn Helling, and Assistant Principal Kristi Minor. Following the Pledge of Allegiance, the Agenda was approved. Next, the August 16 Minutes were approved. The Business Service Reports were then presented and approved. Mrs. Minor then gave her Principal's Report where a student discipline update was provided.

Next Mr. Johnson gave his Superintendent's Report, in which current student count (PK-12: 186) and demographic information was presented along with a general update of the school year thus far. Under "Discussion/Action Items" the Board approved the 2021 Holiday Bonus along with the 2020-21 Financial Audit and a required resolution to define "engaged in the education process".
