Superintendent's Update



Next month, our students will take their state assessments as our 3 rd -8 th Graders will take the Colorado Measures of Academic Success (CMAS) test, which includes sections in Math and English Language Arts (ELA) for all, with additional Science sections for some grade levels. The



Freshmen and Sophomores will take their respective PSAT exams, while the Juniors will take the SAT, which serves as Colorado's official college entrance exam.

Obviously, one cannot solely judge the quality of an education, or a school in general, based on assessment results completed over the course of just a few hours. We all realize there are intangible factors (involvement in extra-curriculars, learning to successfully balance school with work, family, and life in general, treating adults and peers with respect, being prepared for the 'real world', etc) that assessment results simply cannot gauge. I believe Idalia's staff, students, and community at large do a nice job of seeing the 'big picture', and our priorities are reflective of this. Our staff does not spend every educational minute 'teaching to the test', but instead do a fantastic job balancing the demands of standards and curriculum benchmarks with developing relationships with students while taking opportunities to teach and discuss 'life lessons'. My hope is that our students do not feel like they are being force fed facts and information just so they can score well on one test a year, but rather they feel valued and challenged by a staff that cares for them as both students, but more importantly young humans. I am confident this is largely the case.

With this being said, I take this opportunity to emphasize just how important next month's state assessments are. Our high school students will be taking the PSAT and SAT. Their results on this high- stakes test could mean the difference between being accepted into College 'A' over a less desirable College 'B'. Not to mention the financial incentive of scoring well enough to qualify for certain scholarship opportunities. Individual CMAS results are analyzed and considered when making decisions such as if a student would benefit from extra supports, whether that be through our Special Education department, or other supports such as 504 plans, ELL or Title services. Whereas individual incentives largely drive SAT/PSAT results, our elementary and junior high students' CMAS results are more reflective of our school district as a whole. Accountability in public education is incredibly complex (and far from perfect), but our students' performance on CMAS impacts our overall District Performance Framework (DPF), which essentially serves as our school's "report card" when it comes to accreditation rankings with CDE. In short, these assessments matter – both on the micro and macro levels. As we continue our constant parent/school partnership, I respectfully ask that you do your part in preparing your child(ren) for success on their upcoming assessments. Along with offering the generic guidelines such as making sure your child is well-rested and fed the days of the test, I believe the most important thing you can do is reinforce to your child that they should always give their best effort; at everything they do in life, and these tests are no exception.

*For various reasons, some students and families may not feel comfortable taking the state assessments (specifically the CMAS exam). We respect each family's decision and anyone wanting to opt-out of these tests can do so without penalty or consequence (please contact Ms. Cominiello @ cominielloc@idaliaco.us or locate the opt-out form on our school's website).

Parents:

The Colorado Measures of Academic Success (CMAS) assessment will be administered this Spring beginning April 17th, 2023 and ending April 21st. Grades 3rd, 4th, 6th and 7th will take three units of math and three units of language arts. Grades 5th and 8th will take three units of math, three units of language arts, and three units of science. The 11th grade will take three units of science.

The majority of CMAS testing will occur over the duration of five days (4/17 - 4/21). The next week (4/24 - 4/28) will be allotted for make-up testing.




