Youth and their parents can visit the I Matter platform to take a confidential online survey about their mental health and schedule sessions with a licensed behavioral health clinician, primarily online over telehealth. All Colorado youth ages 18 or younger—or 21 and younger if receiving special education services—are eligible to receive free services. No matter your responses, youth will be eligible for 6 free counseling sessions.

State law allows youth ages 12 and up to use the platform independently; youth ages 11 and



younger will need their parent or guardian's consent to sign up.

Colorado House Bill 21-1258 established this temporary program to provide access to mental health and substance use disorder services for youth. including addressing needs that may have resulted from the COVID-19 pandemic. In June 2021, Governor Jared Polis signed bipartisan legislation, which dedicated \$9 million to the program as part of the Polis-Primavera administration's Colorado Comeback roadmap. I Matter is funded and administered by the Colorado Department of Human Services, Office of Behavioral Health. The program is funded through June 30, 2024.

August Board Meeting Minutes

On August 16th, the board meeting was called to order at 7:00 pm. Those in attendance included Board Members Amber Hardwick, Jessica Towns, Dustin Weyerman, Andy Richards, Superintendent Myles Johnson, Assistant Principal Kristi Minor, and Business Manager Autumn Helling. Following the Pledge of Allegiance, the agenda was approved. Next, the June 19th minutes were approved. The Business Service Reports were then presented and approved. Mr. Johnson then gave his Superintendent's Report, in which he provided a current student count (162: PK-12), along with briefing the board on Spring 2023 assessment results, which were among the state's best. Under "Discussion/Action Items," the board approved a staff birthday gift of \$50 as well as a motion to participate in the upcoming coordinated election, in which two board seats will be up for election. Under "Personnel," the board approved a summer weights stipend, along with a contract to hire Brad Stults as custodian. The board also approved the substitute teacher and bus driver lists as presented. Under "Policy," the board approved policy GCGB-R (substitute teacher pay) as presented. The meeting was adjourned at 7:35 pm and next meeting was scheduled for September 20th at 7 pm.

Superintendent's Update

Ready. Set. Go. We are off and running here at the school – when this goes to print, we will be three full weeks into the new academic year. Students and staff (and I'm sure parents as well), regardless of how many years we've done it, must annually navigate the transition from summer back to school. As far as I can tell, everyone involved has excelled at getting back into the rhythm of school and the year is off to a great start. As another academic year gets underway, I have some exciting news to share regarding our students' academic progress. Just days ago, the Colorado Department of Education (CDE) released District Performance Frameworks (DPF), which takes data from three key areas:

Academic Achievement, Academic Growth, and Post-Secondary and Workforce Readiness. This DPF essentially serves as a "report card" for our school district as a whole. Our school easily achieved the highest possible ranking of "Accredited with Distinction," scoring 83.2 of the possible 100 points. This is, by far, the highest Idalia has scored in the seven years I have been here. Obviously judging the quality of a school goes far beyond a few test scores, but objective data is one the many measures we review and analyze each year.

When looking at CMAS scores specifically (taken by 3rd -11th graders), Idalia ranks 3rd out of the more than 55 Eastern Colorado School districts in academic achievement. Our high school students took the PSAT and SAT last Spring, and they collectively grew by over 5 percentage points from the year previous, where they far exceeded national averages. I could go on and on highlighting our results. In short, our students and staff knocked it out of the park and we are incredibly proud of their efforts. Although we would like to enjoy and celebrate the many successes of last year, we realize school is well underway and instead turn our focus to the 2023-24 academic year and all the work we have in front of us. Last year's results prove what our students are capable of. We will hold our students to that standard as we look to build upon the positive momentum and keep moving in the right direction as we continue to be one of the premier schools in Eastern Colorado.

In closing, congratulations to the students and staff alike on their impressive performance last year – it is always rewarding to see objective data to validate all the good things that are happening each and every day in our classrooms.

As part of the requirements to participate in the Perkins grant funding, CTE programs must complete a region needs assessment. All the schools in Northeast Colorado will compile the results from each district to determine where our programs need to focus on in the future years.
